

LSCB Structure Explained

Bracknell Forest LSCB is composed of:

- 1) **An overarching LSCB Board** – setting vision and direction; reviewing and approving developments;
- 2) **An Executive** with responsibility for overseeing and monitoring new developments more closely; commenting on draft proposals and responding to urgent developments;

The following subgroups of the LSCB report to the Board:

- 3) **A Quality Standards and Case Review Group** – reviewing data trends in safeguarding and analysing case management and records (with rotating themes);
- 4) **Anti-Bullying Working Group** – monitoring the rate of bullying in Bracknell Forest, and trying to prevent bullying in schools and other settings;
- 5) **Raising Awareness Task group** – focuses on building safeguarding awareness with the local community, professionals and volunteers;
- 6) **Prostitution sub group** – focuses on identifying and preventing prostitution activity;
- 7) **Serious Case Review sub group** – which is convened if a serious incident occurs, to see what lessons can be learnt to try and stop the same thing happening again.

The following group reports to all three LSCBs in Berkshire East (Slough, Windsor and Maidenhead and Bracknell Forest) and promotes joint working across the three areas:

- ❖ **An East of Berkshire Training Subgroup** – overseeing Safeguarding training for partner agencies working across East Berkshire.

These groups report to all 6 Berkshire LSCBs and co-ordinate a common approach with Pan-Berkshire partners:

- ❖ **A Child Death Overview Group** – developing procedures for monitoring child deaths across the Berkshire population and responding to unexpected or unexplained child deaths;
- ❖ **A Policy and Procedures Group** – reviewing and updating the Berkshire Child Protection Procedures (the Procedures every professional and volunteer follows if they have a concern about a child/young person).
